Josiah W. Ward Called by Death

Josiah W. Ward, 90 years of age, died at 8:30 this morning, after a long illness. He had been bedfast since last Christmas.

The body was taken to the L.H. Jones Funeral Home, where from plans are being made. The time of funeral had not been definitely set today, but it will be at the funeral home.

Born in Illinois

Mr. Ward was born March 26, 1848, in Crawford County, Illinois, a son of Tartus and Elvira Doolittle Ward, who came to Washington County with their family in 1860 and located on a farm three miles Southeast of Riverside where he was reared.

On March 21, 1877, he was married to Ellen Tansey, a neighbor girl, and they began their married life on the farm his father had purchased when he came to Iowa.

Lived in Kansas

They moved to Crawford County, Kansas in 1906, and to Manhattan, Kansas in 1917. Two years ago they returned to Washington County and their home has been at Havre.

Mr. Ward attended the Methodist church when his health permitted.
