The Kansas City Telephone Company was created by the merger of the two existing telephone companies in August 1918. The company's headquarters was located at 11<sup>th</sup> and Oak Streets in downtown Kansas City, Missouri.

The Booster Club was a club consisting of Telephone Company employees. *The Booster* magazine was created, compiled, and published by club members.

This collection consists of a bound edition of *The Booster* magazine. This edition contains all volume published in 1924.
