The 3^d Iowa Infantry remained in Missouri until March 1862.

Page 201.

The winter of 1862 found the regiment scattered in detachments of one or two companies, each at stations along the line of the North Missouri railway, guarding the line and keeping it open for the transportation of troops and supplies.

Early in the spring of '62 found themselves embarked at St. Louis as part of the army of reinforcements to Genl. Grant who had just captured Fort Donelson and Henry and was preparing to move against Johnson at Corinth, Mississippi.

The brigade consisted of the 28th, 32rd, and 41st Illinois regiments and the 3rd Iowa formed a part of the 4th Division, Army of the Tennessee.

Back of Prentiss and near a peach orchard, lay the Fourth Division under Brig. Genl. S. A. Hurlbut. His only Iowa regt. was the 3rd, whos experiences in Missouri and its battle of Blue Mills had made it almost a veteran regiment in the army of untried soldiers. Its first Col. Nelson G. Williams of Dubuque, now commanded the brigade, and Major Wm. M. Stone (One day to be Govenor of Iowa) had taken command of the 3rd in the absence of the Lieutenant Col. John Scott, who was ill. 20.

All of this information has been transcribed from the military records of Milton W. Chapman who first served with Company F, 3^d Regiment Iowa Volunteer Infantry from June 8, 1861 to February 11, 1863 and then served with Company I, 2^d Regiment Iowa Volunteer Cavalry from February 23, 1864 to September 19, 1865. Altogether this amounts to a total time of three years and nearly three months he served with the federal army in the War Between The States, 1861-1865.

The records originally were transcribed from the original Company Records of the Regiments by Copiests, this now being the nature of the Records which are now supplied by the National Archives in Washington, D.C..

I have arranged this information chronologically and have tried to show all information pertinent to said soldier with a minimum of reference to the printed matter on the Forms which the Copiest used in transcribing from the original information.

This compilation was done by Edward E. (Ward) Bartlett, great-grandson of Milton W. Chapman, April 14, 1984.

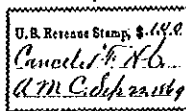

Milton W. Chapman

In July, 1873, Milton W. Chapman and wife and three children came from West Union, Iowa, to Freedom township, Phillips county, Kansas, and homesteaded on the head of PlotnerCreek. They lived in the covered wagon until he felled cottonwood logs enough for a two roomed log house and hauled some of the logs to Phillipsburg where he had them sawed by Jake Close into shingles, floors and other needed lumber. They had a big fireplace and burned logs, using the fireplace to cook for a long time.

The Indians and buffalo were very thick here at that time, also wild turkeys. One hard year my father said they ate so many turkeys for meat that he never wanted to see a turkey afterwards to eat. Also buffalo meat was plentiful in those days. They hauled wheat to Kearney, Neb., for flour and supplies. They knew the hardships of the grasshopper year.

He helped to organize the Iowa Union school district, Number 23. The three children attended school there and Iowa and Hattie Chapman went from there to teach schools for a number of years. In those days the teacher "boarded around" from house to house and held the school in a dugout or a sod house with no floor or made desks or conveniences of any kind, and a slate and pencil in place of pen and ink.

Wages ran from seven to fifteen dollars a month. If the teacher wanted a chair she had to furnish one from home.

Mr. Chapman helped to choose the location of Iowa Union cemetery and helped to dig the first grave put into the cemetery.

In 1881, one more child was added to the family, now Mrs. John Reece, who still lives in the neighborhood. The son moved to Seattle, Wash. One daughter is dead. Mrs. Iowa Halderman lives northwest of Long Island, Kans.

In 1885 Mr. Chapman sold the old homestead and moved to his timber claim joining the homestead on the east, now owned by Mrs. Joseph Dupree. He lived there until he sold out and moved to Long Island in 1903. There they lived until the death of Mrs. Chapman in 1914, when he went to spend his time between the two daughters who both live near Long Island, at which place he is still living at the good old age of 92 years on the 27th day of April 1927.

Mr. Chapman served in the Civil War for 35 months and 11 days from West Union, Iowa.

I also want to include a Civil War Veteran of this community -- Eunice's Grandfather Chapman. He made his home with John and Louise Chapman Reece in summers and with Iowa Chapman Halderman and her husband Mac during winters to be closer to the doctor when roads were bad. Yes, Long Island had a doctor in those days. He was a surgeon too. Grandpa Chapman is buried at Long Island cemetery. I remember of Grandpa Chapman telling of troop trains during the Civil War. They seemed to like to load at night, he said, preferably in the rain so uniforms would get wet after they took their tents down. The common carrier was a freight train bedded with straw. One night it was especially well-bedded and he slept unusually well. The next morning he discovered the cavalry had used it before and left an extra six inches of bedding under the straw.

MILTON WILLIAM CHAPMAN (1835 - 1929)

Milton W. CHAPMAN was born in Medina County, Ohio 27 April 1835, was the son of Cyrus and Jerusha Dennison (HOSMER) CHAPMAN

His father, Cyrus, and family were recorded in the 1840 census living in the town of Seville, Medina County, Ohio. Some time before 1850 Cyrus moved taking his family to Walworth County, Wisconsin. The 1st of February, 1848, a patent was issued to Cyrus Chapman for 160 acres of land in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31, Township 1, North of Range 15E in the district of land subject to sale at Milwaukee, Wisconsin Territory. Payment for the land was made by Edward WINNE, son-in-law of Cyrus.

Milton W. appears, at age 15, in the 1850 census of the town of Sharon, Walworth County, Wisconsin, along with his parents and siblings. Also with them is his youngest brother, Orville who was age 3 and born in Wisconsin. Orville was born 10 August 1846 at Sharon thus it is evident that the family had moved to Wisconsin by that time at least.

By 1860 the family had moved about one hundred and seventy miles further west, up into Fayette County, Iowa. It was from here that Milton got hyped up and enlisted in the union army. At age 28, Milton, on the 8th of June 1861 joined for duty and enrolled in Company F, 3rd Regiment Iowa Infantry. A Certificate of Disability for Discharge, dated 9 January 1863 and signed by his company commander, Captain Jacob Swank briefly but poignantly tells the story of his tour of duty as follows:

"During the last two months said soldier has been unfit for duty 60 days. This soldier was healthy when he enlisted & was a good soldier until about the 17th of March 1862 while on the boat with regiment going from Cairo to Pittsburg Landing he was taken with Diarrhea and has done no duty since Except to fight two days at battle of Shiloh he is much Emaciated and complains of a pain in his right side."

In August of 1862 bureaucratic bungling got Milton the charge of desertion - deserted August 18/62 at Memphis was entered on his record. It appears they never found him to courtmartial him and on 15 December 1874 the War Department, Adjutant General's Office removed this charge.

Returning to Fayette County Milton married Estella Almira WEST, daughter of Ezra B. and Sophia (___) WEST at West Union, Fayette County, Iowa, 4th of June 1863.

It appears that the diarrhea that got him the discharge from the army in 1863 had subsided so with his enthusiasm for the cause along with the offer of a \$300.00 Bounty, on 23rd February 1864, Milton was mustered into Company I, 2nd Regiment Iowa Cavalry. This time Milton spent 6 months at the hospital at Memphis, Tennessee, or about one third of the time he was with the 2nd Iowa Cavalry. The records do not reveal the cause for so much time spent at the hospital.

He was mustered out of the army in Selma, Alabama, 19th September 1865. The Company Descriptive Book described Milton as follows:

Age 28 years; height 5 feet 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches
Complexion medium; eyes grey; hair grey
Where born, Medina, Ohio; Occupation, Farmer

In June of 1870 Milton is farming in Pleasant Valley Township of Fayette county. His farm was valued at \$600.00 and his personal property at \$500.00. He and Stella now have a family of two daughters and a son.

In July of 1873 Milton, his wife, Stella and their three children moved from Fayette County, Iowa, to Freedom Township in Phillips County, Kansas. There they settled at the head of Plotner Creek, living in their covered wagon until they were able to put up a two room log house of cottonwood logs. Logs were taken to Phillipsburg to be sawed into the needed boards and shingles. Warmth was supplied by a large fireplace which also provided a place to cook their food.

Later Milton applied for "Homestead" land and on the 30th of December 1879 was issued a Certificate for 160 acres in Section Eight, Township two of Range eighteen. Milton and Stella on the 27th of October 1884 sold this 160 acres to Deloss D. Pomeroy for \$1,000.00.

In July of 1881 Milton and Stella were blessed with a fourth child, a daughter. All the children in that portion of the county were educated at the Iowa Union district No. 23 school. Their daughters, Iowa and Hattie, taught in the local school while yet young ladies.

Milton later on purchased 80 acres from his daughter Iowa. Land that she had obtained in March of 1890 under a homestead act. This was located adjacent to the east side of his previous land. Milton was a farmer all of his life. A record for 1895 provides information about his farm as follows:

A note in the margin of the record, "85 or 90 % of winter wheat killed", provides a glimpse of the eternal uncertainties for the farmer.

It was on this 80 acres that they lived up to 1903 when Milton sold out and moved into the village of Long Island, Kansas. There they lived until Stella's death in 1914. After that Milton divided his time living with one or the other of his two daughters, Iowa and Louise.

Milton William CHAPMAN died on the 26th of June 1929, aged 94 years, 1 month and 29 days. Milton and Stella are buried in the Long Island cemetery, off to the northwest from Long Island, Kansas.
