THE REV. RICHARD H. and ANN HADLEY ASH

Richard Hamilton Ash and Alicia Ann Ritchey Hadley were married April 5, 1975 at Trinity Episcopal Church, St. Louis, by the Rt. Rev. George Cadigan, Episcopal Bishop of Missouri. Richard and Ann live in the Vicarage of St. Matthew's Episcopal Church at 1212 Ringo, Mexico. Richard was born in 1924 in Sydney, Ohio, the only child of Lyle Ash and Mary Malinda Loudenback. Richard's father and mother were born in Ohio in 1899.

Alicia Ann Ritchey Ash was born in 1932 in Tulsa, Oklahoma, the eldest of three daughters of Claude Chauncy Ritchey and Ruth Elizabeth Graves. Ann's mother and father were born in Oklahoma (then Indian Territory) in 1904 and 1906.

Richard Ash has six children and Ann has three children. Between them they presently have nine grandchildren. Richard's children are David, James, Christopher, Carl, Mary, and Dorothy Ash, who live in California, Colorado, Kansas City, and Bowling Green. After their marriage, Clarence and Allie lived in Ralls County, a few miles south of Perry, until Clarence's death in 1913. Then Allie moved to Laddonia where she resided until May, 1983, and at that time moved to the Twain Haven Nursing Home in Perry. Prior to her marriage, Allie attended Kirksville Normal School, in Kirksville, taught school for a few years, and after her marriage worked in a Bank in Laddonia for a number of years. She is a member of the Laddonia Catholic Church, was involved in all community and area affairs, and active in the Democratic

Party - however failing eye-sight in later years curtailed many of her activities.

Anna was born in 1899 in Martinsburg, the third child of Liborius Ahrens and Magdalen Inglemann. Anna died in 1976 and is buried in St. Joseph's Cemetery south of Martinsburg.
