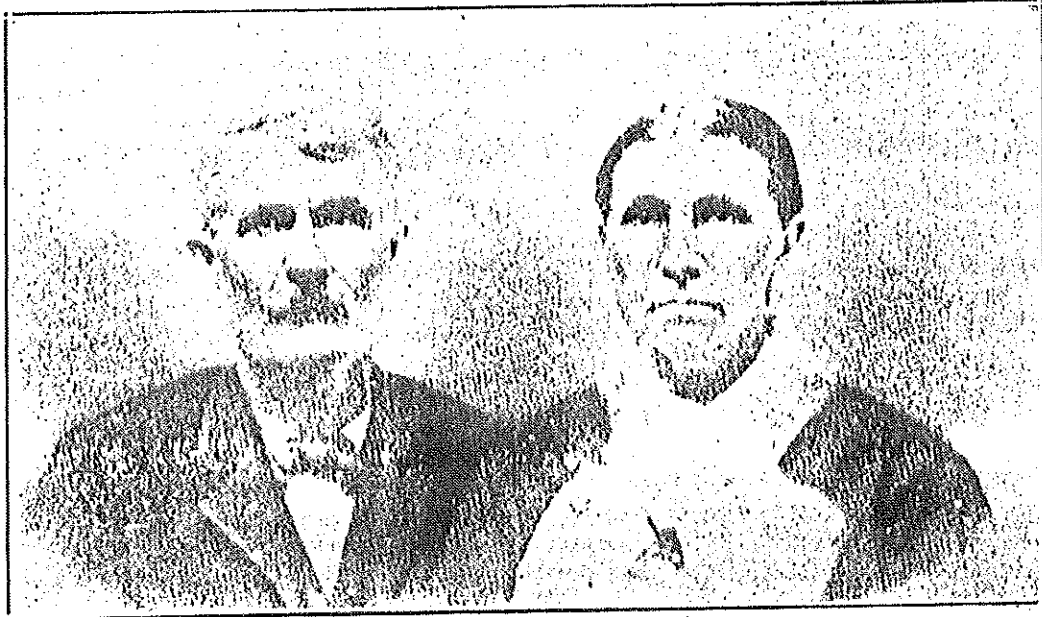

OBITUARY

Miss Electa F. Ward was born in Newark, Ohio, March 24, 1831. She moved with her parents to Crawford county, Illinois, in 1848, and on Nov. 27, 1849 she was united in marriage to William R. Doolittle.

Mr. and Mrs. Doolittle then moved to their new home in Bel-laire, Ill., where they remained on a farm until 1856. Then with her husband and three children she moved to Story county and settled on a farm three miles south of Story City. They reared a family of 10 children with the exception of one daughter who died in childhood. She remained there forty-eight years. Her husband departed from this life, Dec. 26, 1893.

In 1905, together with her daughter, Miss Emma, she moved to Roland where they lived ten years. Then they moved to Story City where Mrs. Doolittle passed away August 29, 1922, at the age of 91 years, 5 months, and 5 days.

She leaves to mourn her death four sons, three daughters, F. D. W. J. and Ira D. of Story City and R. L. of Webster City, Mrs. T. E. Carlton of Rolfe, Mrs. Electa Brown and Miss Emma of Story City.

Besides her immediate family she leaves to mourn her loss 26 grandchildren, 34 great grandchildren and 2 great great grandchildren, and a host of friends.

Mrs. Doolittle lived to be the oldest of her family of four brothers and one sister. Her children were all present at her funeral and all her grandchildren but six.

The funeral services were conducted in the home Friday after-

noon, Rev. Zastos of Boone officiating. The deceased had selected the same hymns which were sung at her husband's funeral and these were beautifully rendered by Mr. and Mrs. Otis Boyd of Roland. The pall bearers were the following grandsons; Frank, Lester, Clarence and Fred Doolittle, Ira Brown and Frank Carlton.

Hughes of Ames, Messrs. and Mesdames Fred Doolittle, Guy Doolittle, Chas. Doolittle and Chas. Grein of Blairsburg.
