DeWitt C. Chapman's Military Service Facts

DeWitt C. Chapman volunteered 23 Feb. 1864 at New Hampton, Chickasaw Co., Iowa, and was mustered in to Co. I, 2^d Regt., Iowa Cavalry, commanded by Berry K. Watson. He was Honorably Discharged at Selma, Alabama, 19 Sept. 1865. He was 38 years old, of 5^{ft} - $9\frac{1}{2}$ in height, medium complexion, brown hair, hazel eyes. He was almost wholly disabled due to the war. He had piles, sore and watery eyes, diarrhea, and deafness.

The Adjutant General's Office has DeWitt's grave registration. The register gives his date and place of birth as 12th Feb. 1826, Medina Co., Ohio. His place of death as Primghar, Iowa, but no date. It lists Cyrus and Jerusa*Hosmer as well as wife, Elizabeth Kennedy. Children: Weston, Frank, Orrin, George, Elmer, Arthur, Jay and Roy. His residence at time of enlistment was New Hampton, Iowa, at age 38, on Feb. 24th, 1864. He was discharged Sept. 19, 1865, at Selma, Alabama, with the rank of Private. His interment was at the Pleasant Hill cemetery in Block 14, Lot No. 1.

Death of D. C. Chapman

D. C. Chapman, ac old soldier and one of the original settlers of O'Brien County, died at Deer Creek, Minn., last Friday and the remains were buried in Prim-

ghar or, Monday,

Comrade Chapman was a gallant soldler, having served his country bravely in the time of its greatest need; he was a member of S. F. Jordan Post, of Primghar, Grand Army of the Republic, and his death reduces the number in the Post to 11. He has been greatly afflicted for many years with palsy, so that he has been nearly helplesscould not even get food into his mouth without help. However, until his last sickness, he has been able to get about quite readily and he spent a good deal of his time in going from place to place visiting his children. He was taken sick at the home of his son at Deer Greek, Minn., about 10 days before his death.

f Comrade Chapman was honest, well-meaning in all his dealings with men; a good neighbor, and did his share in the development

of the county.

The remains were brought to this place Sunday evening and the funeral was held from the Congregation of chains at 2,00 colook Manday after acon. Rev. o'clock Monday afternoon, Rev. Pierce conducting the services, which were impressive. There was singing of several appropriate hymns by a select choir-Parker Whitehouse, Mrs. Ward, Miss VanBenthysen, Mrs. Rose-crans and R. E. Langley.

OBITUARY

Dewitt 'C. Chapman was born in Medina county, Ohio, Feb. 12, 1826. Died at Deer Creck, Minn., March 8, 1912, aged 86 years and 25! days. He was married at Winslow, Ill., Jan. 1, 1851, to Elizabeth Kennedy. Nine children were born to them, six of whom are still living.

He moved with the family to O'Brien County, Iowa, in June, 1871, where he has since resided. He was a volunteer in Company I, 2nd Iowa Cavalry; enlisted Feb. 26, 1864, and was dischargedSept.

19, 1865.

He was a devoted husband and loving father. His wife, Elizabeth Chapman, died May 21, 1901. Six sons survive him, five of whom were present at the funeral. Those present were: E. E.
