OBITUARY OF AMANDA CAROLINE (BAXTER) BRANDON

Mrs. Amanda (Baxter) Brandon, born in Pike Co., Mo., Nov. 17, 1836, near Louisiana, Mo., died at her home in Farber, Mo., Dec. 20, 1916.

She was married to Mr. (Marshall) M. M. Brandon, in (Apr. 7,) 1853, who preceeded her to the grave about 23 yrs. ago. (Sept. 22, 1893) To this union was born 8 children, 4 girls and 4 boys. All living except one daughter. Her children are the following:

Mrs. Brandon married John Nalley April 27, 1898. She joined the Cumberland Presbyterian church at the age of 16. She died at the age of 80 years, 1 month and 3 days. She leaves an aged father and a host of relatives and friends, including 32 grandchildren and 46 great grandchildren.

The Rev. S. E. McDonald conducted the funeral at the Presbyterian church, Dec. 21, 1916. She was buried at Farber. She was one of the landmarks of this community and her relatives have the sympathy of all.
