



25 Years Ago—— in and About Alton

January 20, 1914

P. W. Coyle and H. M. Schwoppe, members of the park commission, had superintended laying out of the lines for a wading pool at Rock Spring park. They announced that, while all improvements planned for Riverview park could not be completed in one year, they hoped the combination bandstand and shelter house would be.
