MEMORANDUM

The Old Ford Records are copied from Timothy Ford's Bible, Garrard Co. Ky., a school teacher born in Goochland Co. Va. Sept. 16, 1773. His father, Rev. Reuben Ford and his grandfather, Rev. Mr. Hebber of Goochland Co. Va. were among the first Baptist ministers of Virginia. They helped separate the church from the state. Rev. Hebber was imprisoned in Urbanna Prison, Middlesex Co. in Aug. 1771 for preaching the Baptist Religion.

Wm. Hebber was an Infantry soldier in Rev. War. Enlisted May 16, 1783.

Rev. Reuben Ford had a Rev. War record.

Edmond Dorrel Ford fought in the Mexican War.

Fred Ford fought in World War I. Carey Ford was on the ocean one night when the Armistice was signed.

Cecil Ford fought in World War II.


