J. H. GATES OF ALEXANDRIA IS CALLED BY DEATH

J. H. Gates, of Alexandria, Mo., father of Mrs. Thomas Kollmyer of Keokuk, died Monday at 3:40 p. m. his death being caused by erysipelas at the age of sixty-one years, four months and twenty days.

Mr. Gates was born at Alexandria on June 27, 1864, and had spent his entire life there. He leaves to mourn his death two sons and three daughters: Mrs. G. W. Bryant of Ft. Madison, Iowa; Frank Gates, and Oscar Gates, both of Alexandria, Mo.; Mrs. Gene Bennett of Alexandria, Mo., and Mrs. Thomas Kollmyer of Keokuk, Iowa; eight grandchildren; two brothers, Henry Gates of Keokuk, Iowa, and Ben Gates of Wyandona, Mo., and several nieces and nephews. His wife and one son died several years ago.

The funeral will be held Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock from the home of Mr. Gates' son, Oscar Gates.
