following obituary telling
the death of one of the pion-
s of the Long Island commun-
just comes to us from Can-
ada. It is as follows:

Death took the toll of another
old time resident of the Frontier
district in the person of Dayton
Barrett Halderman, who passed
away on Wednesday, October 25,
at the age of 66 years. Funeral
services were held at the United
Church, Frontier, on Saturday,
Mr. J. Ludford officiating. The
church was filled to capacity,
many sympathizers being unable
to gain admittance. A quantity of
beautiful flowers covered the
coffin. The interment was made
at Ridgely cemetery north of
Frontier where lie two sons of
the deceased. Pall bearers were
chosen from old acquaintances

of the deceased, residents of the
district. *Wed 1937*

Dayton B. Halderman, as he was
better known, was born in Iowa
on the 21st day of August, 1871.
In the year 1902 he married
Mary Strickler in North Dakota.
He farmed there until 1908 when
he moved to Manitoba. From
Manitoba he returned to Kansas
from whence he again came to
Canada settling in the Frontier
District at which location he was
resident at the time of his death.

Five sons and four daughters
were born to the marriage, two
sons, Herbert and George preced-
ing him, both suffering tragic
deaths, the former by drowning
in the Whitemud River and the
latter by carbon monoxide pois-
oning. *1937 1937*

Besides his widow, he is sur-
vived by three sons, Frank, Glen
and Douglass and four daughters
Mrs. T. Drengstb, Mrs. Brough-
ton, Genevieve and Barbara. The
sympathy of the people of the
district is extended to them in
their bereavement.

Frank Ronald Halderman of Shaunavon died at the Shaunavon Union Hospital on September 22 at the age of 75. Born in Cando, North Dakota on April 9, 1904, he moved with his parents to Saskatchewan in 1911. He farmed at Frontler until 1937, when he bought grain for the Wheat Pool at Knollys and later at Instow. While at Instow, he was leader of the Pioneer Grain Club and helped promote Co-op schools. *acting in Centre United Church.*

In 1940 he married Anne Lee in Brandon Manitoba. In 1941 they moved to Shaunavon where he was manager of the Shaunavon Co-op until 1951, when he became a supervisor for Federated Co-operatives. While in Shaunavon, he helped organize the Shaunavon Credit Union in 1944, and gave his services gratis as first Secretary Manager. He was a member of the Shaunavon Town Council for a term and a Past Master of the Masonic Lodge.

His hobby was golf, and he gave much of his time to the early Shaunavon golf course. Retirement years have been spent in Arizona and Texas. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to either the Frontler or Shaunavon Golf Course or to the charity of one's choice.

Funeral services were held in Frontler United Church on Monday, September 24 with Rev. Margaret McMillan officiating. Interment took place at Ridgely Cemetery, north of Frontler. Binkley's Funeral Service of Shaunavon was in charge of arrangements.

Pallbearers were Gall Halderman, Lenard Halderman, Dan Halderman, David Halderman, David Friggstad and Gerry Evenson.

Honorary Pallbearers were Harold Hanlon, Edgar Boyle, Ed Selvig, Cleo Mitchell, Frank Hook and Jake Van Brunt.

He is survived by his wife, and one son, Barrett and daughter-in-law Betty, of Humboldt, besides brothers, Douglas, Frontler, Glenn, Brooks, Alberta, sisters Genevieve, Stranahan, and Barbara Buttery, Edmonton, Orlean Boughton, Three Rivers, Michigan, Mae Drengson, Grandview, Washington. A daughter, Dianne, predeceased him in 1975.
