### Jay Smith

BOWLING GREEN, Mo. — Jay O. Smith, 74, of Bowling Green, formerly of Hannibal, died at 11:07 a.m. Saturday (March 24, 1984) in the Harry S. Truman Veterans Hospital in Columbia.

Mr. Smith was born July 12, 1909, in Pike County, Mo., the son of Elliott Lester and Betty Elizabeth Henderson Smith. He married Nellie M. Brandon on March 27, 1932, in Clarksville. She survives. He retired in June of 1974 as shop foreman for Harris Oldsmobile Cadillac Garage in Hannibal. He was formerly employed with the Warnick Motor Company, the Willey Motor Company, and the Rendlen Motor Company, all of Hannibal. After his retirement, he was associated with the Smith Funeral Home until he moved to Bowling Green in 1980. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Bowling Green, was a member and past commander of the Emmett Shields Post No. 55 of the American Legion, and was an Army veteran of World War II.

He is also survived by one son, Mike Smith of Columbia; one sister, Mrs. Sam (Lola Blanche) Palmer of Bowling Green; and three grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by two brothers and a sister.

Services will be held at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday in the Smith Funeral Chapel, conducted by the Rev. Jerry Turner and the Rev. Claude Stone, Jr. Burial will be in Grandview Burial Park. Memorials may be made to the First United Methodist Church of Bowling Green or the American Cancer Society. Visitation will be held from 4-8:30 p.m. Monday at the home.
