In the name of God Amen: I Amos Thomas of the County of Pike in the State of Missouri being of sound mind and memory but in feeble health and considering the uncertainties of this frail and transitory life do herefore make ordain publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament. That is to Say ... First I desire that after my decease my Funeral expenses together with all my other lawful debts shall be fully paid and discharged The residue of my estate both real and personal I give bequeath and dispose of as follows to Wit, To my beloved wife Jemima Thomas I give and bequeath the following named Slaves to Wit, John aged about twenty three years Harrison aged about twelve years Two mare mules both Bay Mules Known and called by the names of Sal and Jenny One Bay mare called Mary One wagon and gears. Three Cows of her own selection from my Stock of Cattle Ten head of sheep. Ten head of Hogs also to be selected as above mentioned and all of the Household and Kitchen furniture including Bed Bedding and every variety and description of furniture what so ever belonging to me at the time of My decease. I also give and bequeath to my wife the Buggy now owned by me to have and to hold the Property above mentioned and described to her my Said Wife Jemima Thomas for her own proper use benefit & behoof during her Widowhood and Life upon the express condition that she will remain my Widow, but if after my decease She shall determine and does marry again then and in that case the property of every description above Mentioned & bequeathed shall belong to my bodily heirs to be equally divided among them. Share and Share alike with also the further provisions that she my said wife Jemima Thomas is hereby Authorized & empowered to make such dispositions of the property Above bequeathed as She may deem just and right among the several heirs of my body upon her compliance with the condition above mentioned. To my Son Silas Thomas (in addition to the lands already conveyed to him,) I give and bequeath the following in described tract or parcel of Land Situate and being in the County of Pike in the State of Missouri to Wit: The North West quarter of the North West quarter of Section Fifteen (15) in Township Fifty three (53) of Range Four West in the district of Lands Subject to Sale at Palmyra Missouri Containing Forty Acres To have and to hold the Same upon the express condition that my daughter Nancy Harris the wife of Robert Harris shall have the Privilege of taking such quantities of rock off said tract of Land as she may find necessary for improvement on the tract of Land I have lately deeded to her Situated in the vicinity of my Son Silas Thomas's Land. I also give and bequeath unto my Said Son Silas Thomas the Sum of One hundred and thirty dollars the same being the amount collected by him for me from Dudley Phears and further more I hereby give to My Son Silas Thomas the sum of Four Hundred Dollars to be collected from the Sale of My Property and effects after my decease. In Trust however for the Use and benefit of my Four Grand Children to Wit; William Margaret Frank and Samuel they being the children of my deceased daughter Jane Frye Thomas of the State of California I give and bequeath the sum of Five hundred dollars the same being a sum of money borrowed from Nathaniel Williams by Said Franklin Thomas for the payment of which I have become accountable. The residue of my estate both real and personal I desire to be sold at publick sale at a proper and suitable time after my decease the proceeds of which Sale I desire to be equally divided among my children as follows, Ann Brandon Silas Thomas Margaret Grafford Lewis Thomas James August Oury of the City of Louisiana and Silas Thomas my son Executors of this my Last Will and Testament

Prior to 1875 there was no regular preaching by the Baptists in Curryville, Pike County, Missouri. A union church was built during the summer and fall of 1875.

The third Saturday in November, 1875, the following 18 names were enrolled going into the organization of the Baptist Church: Benjamin King, Luke Lewis, Rachel King, William K. Biggs, Martha Biggs, Emma Biggs, Anna Biggs, James W. Riggs, Lucretia Riggs, M. J. Trabue, William Brandon, Ann Brandon, James E. McPike, H. P. Lewis, Lou Lewis, George W. Wylie, T. J. Ayres, Mollie E. Ayres.

February 21, 1883, William Brandon, a constituent member was called to his reward. At the March meeting, following, the church adopted resolutions of respect to him. By energy and economy, William Brandon had accumulated a good estate. Of these means he contributed at one time \$500.00 to the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, then located at Charleston, South Carolina.

Dimension of Heaven.

Coroner W. H. Campbell being notified of the sudden death of Mrs. Ann Brandon, which occurred Tuesday night, held an inquest over the body yesterday. We only give the testimony of one of the witnesses (which was corroborated by several others) and the verdict of the jury.

I, T. A. TUCK, am sworn, of lawful age, being duly sworn, say, I was at Lopatina on the 18th inst., and returned about 8 o'clock p. m. I found the deceased, as well as usual. I got up about 7 o'clock a. m., on the 19th, about half past eight the boy I have living with me called her. He came back to the cook room and said "Aunt Ann did not answer." My wife then went to see what was the matter; she went to the stair door and called her; she did not answer; she then went into the room of the deceased. She then turned around and came back, where we were at breakfast. My wife said "Tuck, I believe Aunt Ann is dead." I got up and went up in the room and called to her. She did not answer. I walked up close to the bed; I then turned round and stepped back and told my wife and the boy I thought she was dead. I told the boy to get a horse and tell Mr. Tinker and wife to come quickly as they could. She went to her room about 8 $\frac{1}{2}$  o'clock p. m. I did not see anything more of her until morning.
