Which Shut or Unveiled

An American "electron gun" which used the Allies' huge bombing raids the first time today.

A six-foot high frequency tube that sprayed explosive bursts of electrons and blanketed radar apparatus for 300 miles, was credited with much of the success of mass daylight air raids and possibly helped save the lives of hundreds of Allied airmen.

Lifting wartime censorship, the University of California disclosed the details of the resonatron, which was developed from an atom-smasher by two young electrical engineers, Dr. D. H. Sloan and Dr. L. C. Marshall.

Sloan and Marshall started experiments on the resonatron in 1938. By the spring of 1945 they had evolved a "gun" with which the Allies were hurling more raw radio power into the air than any other amplifier ever constructed.

The resonatron was capable of smothering all radio and radar frequencies between 350 and 600 megacycles in a cone 30,000 feet high, 300 miles long and 15 miles wide. With it the Allies kept the enemy from learning in advance the location and direction of the big air fleets that devastated Germany in the closing months of the war. This initial advantage over the Nazi defenses multiplied the Germans' troubles and contributed indirectly to speeding the end of the war.

The resonatron fires a concentrated burst of electrons, within a tall vacuum tube, which explode with tremendous power. The power is broadcast to disrupt radio waves of any desired frequency.

Royal Question Cause of Major Belgium Trouble

BRUSSELS, Jan. 25, (U.P.)—Prime Minister Camille Huysmans declared today that the royal question was the real cause of the present political divisions that exist in Belgium.

In an exclusive interview with the United Press, the Belgian premier set forth the precise attitude of his Socialist government on the highly-charged political controversy centering in the Belgian throne.

"There can be no doubt," Huysmans said, "that the question which has divided the parties most deeply is beyond contest the royal question."

The conflict has raged around King Leopold III, now living in exile in Switzerland. He has not found it possible to return to his kingdom since gaining freedom from his Nazi captors, but Belgian public opinion is sharply divided in its evaluation of his wartime conduct.

It was Leopold who, in May 1940, abruptly surrendered the nation to the Wehrmacht in order, he said, to save Belgian lives.

The king's brother, Prince Charles, has served as regent since Belgium's liberation. Conservative parties seek Leopold's return to the throne while leftist groups oppose his restoration.

Huysmans denied that the royal question was merely a pretext for Belgian political strife. "You can take it from me that the royal question is one of the essential causes

4000 Quakes Caused By Dam Reservoir

 WASHINGTON, Jan. 25.—Man-made earthquakes, more than 4000 small tremors, have been recorded at Lake Mead, the giant reservoir created by Boulder Dam on the Colorado River. Caused by the adjustment of the earth's surface to the weight of 40,000,000,000 tons of water in the lake, the quakes are so slight that only a few could be felt by human beings.

4000 Quakes
 As recorded on seismographs of the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey, the more than 4000 man-made tremors add up to a total force of about 1 per cent of that of one destructive natural quake, the

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
