Author of 'Firekeeper's Daughter' Headlining 'LitUp' 2025

Annual Teen Literature & Arts Festival Brings Acclaimed Authors & Artists to Library Sept. 20

Kansas City, MO – On **Saturday, September 20**, Mid-Continent Public Library will host its eighth-annual LitUp Festival, a free literature and arts event for teens, at its Woodneath Library Center (8900 NE Flintlock Road, Kansas City, Mo.). The day-long program offers kids the opportunity to meet some of their favorite authors and creators and learn how to harness their own creative talents. Headlining this year's festival will be **New York Times** bestselling author Angeline Boulley, whose award-winning debut novel, *Firekeeper's Daughter*, earned rave reviews and was named one of "100 Best YA Books of All Time" by *Time* Magazine. Boulley's newest book, *Sisters in the Wind*, was just released this month.

"LitUp is such a special event because it's created by and for our young community members," said MCPL Programming and Events Manager Colleen Norman. "Our teen ambassadors help drive the process, including giving their feedback on the types of creators they'd like to see. This year's keynote, Angeline Boulley, was certainly at the top of everyone's list, so it's an absolute honor to bring her to Kansas City and hear her story!"

Along with Boulley, LitUp 2025 will include presentations by award-winning author Byron Graves, fantasy storyteller Swati Teerdhala, graphic novelist Ngozi Ukazu, and debut author Jenni Howell. The event starts at 9:00 a.m. and is entirely free to attend, but online registration is required. The event is currently listed as full, but those interested are encouraged to go ahead and join the wait list.
