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was a native of Connecticut, born March 20, 1761. On the 21st day of November, 1782, he became the husband of Rhoda Peck, also a native of Connecticut, born January 27, 1760.

The following account of their emigration westward exhibits some of the phases of pioneer life at that day. Mr. Chapman with his family, consisting of his wife Rhoda, and his children Cyrus, Sceva, Leonard, and Clyne (his sons Levi, Arvis, and Perrin having preceded them the year before), started from Cavendish, Windsor County, Vermont, — where they had spent some years, — on the 20th of June, 1818, with two wagons, one drawn by a span of horses and the other by two yoke of cattle; they also drove a cow. The horse-team got through to Harrisville Township, Medina County, Ohio, some time in August. The ox-team arrived about two weeks later, which was early in September. They came in company to Buffalo, where Cyrus and Sceva went aboard a sloop for Cleveland, taking with them the ox-wagon and yokes. The sloop was two weeks running from Buffalo to Cleveland, being driven back by a gale from near Cleveland to Erie.

The first steamboat on Lake Erie was about completed at Black Rock, and Cyrus and Sceva went on board to view it. When the oxen, having gone by land, reached Cleveland, the sloop had not yet arrived, and Leonard was left in charge of the Oxen awaiting the arrival of the sloop. When the vessel came, the three brothers took the ridge road, by way They passed the night with a man in Grafof Grafton, for Harrisville. There now remained two miles of road not yet cut through, and ton. Sceva drove the team while his two brothers, assisted by the Grafton man just mentioned, cut the underbrush and cleared the way. Sceva thus became the first man who drove a team from Grafton to Harrisville. The cow they brought along more than paid her own expenses, besides furnishing milk for the family. There was only one family in Chatham Township at this time.

Mr. Chapman settled upon a farm near the present village of Lodi, and upon this spot he passed the rest of his life. He and his wife were among the first members of the Baptist Church of Westfield, and he was Deacon of the same. He possessed a great versatility of talent and a natural ingenuity that enabled him to turn his hand to anything in the department of mechanics. He was also an excellent singer, and taught singing-school for quite a number of years. Mrs. Chapman died June 7, 1843, aged eighty-three years; Mr. C., on October 9, 1845, aged eighty-four.

SCEVA CHAPMAN, Harrisville,

was born in Windsor County, Vermont, February 10, 1793. In 1818, as before stated, he came West, and located in Harrisville. His educational advantages were very limited, three months of school being all that he ever had after he had learned to read.

On February 17, 1825, he married Azuba Marsh, of Ashland County. Miss Marsh was born October 7, 1802, in Windham County, Vermont. Her father's family was the third that settled in Medina Township, Medina County.

Mr. Chapman has held a number of township offices, among them that of Treasurer for some twelve years; also that of Trustee for several years, and of School Director for several terms. Mrs. C. has been a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church for half a century. She is in her seventy-second year, and is quite vigorous for her age. The children of the family were as follows: Williard J., who died in infancy; Harrison S., of Lodi; Ozias E., of Bureau County, Illinois; Arminda E., of Lodi; Marinda E. (deceased); Rozella M., now Mrs. E. G. Topping, of Harvey County, Kansas.

HARRISON SCEVA CHAPMAN, Harrisville,

second son of Sceva, was born in Harrisville, July 26, 1830. The common school advantages were all that he ever enjoyed. On August 20, 1860, he married Jane Gilley, of Harrisville. Miss G. was third daughter of Andrew and Catherine Gilley.

Mr. Chapman has been School Director for some nine years, and most of the time Clerk of the District. He has also served as Township trustee. Both he and his wife have been for twenty-two years past active members of the Congregational Church of Lodi, in which he has held for some twenty years the positions of Clerk and of Deacon. The family comprises one daughter, Angie Lena, born March 24, 1862, and one son, Chesley Gilley, born July 10, 1867. Mr. Chapman resides near Lodi, on the paternal acres formerly owned by his grandfather.
