ADDENDUM

William BURBRIDGE

YEAR OF BIRTH:

Although the date of William's birth is given in his obituary it is obviously incorrect as far as the year is concerned. The only census record available that even pretends to give his age is the 1850 Montgomery County, Indiana, census that gives his age as 61.

1850 - 61 = 1789. If he was born 8 Sept. 1789 and the census taken on 26 Aug. 1850, as recorded, then he would have been 60 yrs., 11 mos. & 18 days old, therefore he would not have been quite 61. If rather he had been born 8 Sept. 1788 he would have been 61 yrs, 11 mos. & 18 days old, a birth year of 1788 in his case would be compatible with his age being 61 in the 1850 census.

Another possibility is that the 7 and 8 were transposed when the type was set for the obituary and should have been 1787 instead of 1778, however that would make him 62 yrs., 11 mos. & 18 days old at the time of the 1850 census.

The fact that his father, Rowland Burbridge was in Greenbrier Co., Virginia (W. Va.) in 1787 and in Fayette Co., Kentucky in 1789 and that William was born in Greenbrier county it seems would be sufficient evidence that William was born before 1789 or he would not have been born in Greenbrier Co., Virginia.

Date: Unknown William's first wife died 2 Sept. 1832 and Lavina died 16 Apr. 1836, a time period of only 3 yrs, 7 mos. & 14 days.

2. Jane BURBRIDGE

Widow of James V. CANINE married James M. REEDER, a widower, 27 Aug. 1843, in Montgomery Co., Ind^a. During the 1850 census enumeration in Indiana they are found in Clay Township of Howard County. (Roll #151, page 955/478) They have eight children listed running in ages 1 to 15. They have been married 7 yrs., 1 mo. & 1 dy. when this census was taken. Thus it would seem that only two of the children, Eliza, age 6 and Matilda, age 1 are Jane and Mr. REEDER's children. It seems a possibility that Margaret, age 10, James, age 8 and Sarah D., age 7 could be Jane and James V. CANINE's children. Eliza and Matilda is the names of two of Jane's sisters.

Death of Morgan BURBRIDGE, brother of the late William BURBRIDGE, died at his home near Attica on last Wednesday of blood poisoning at the age of 71 years. The deceased was a native of this city, being the son of JUDGE BURBRIDGE and brother of Mr. F. G. MC INTIRE's mother and Mrs. Irwin M. DUNN.

Morgan's wife, Rachael A. JONES, is a daughter of John and Susannah JONES. Her father was a native of Virginia and her mother a native of Tennessee. They settled in Washington Township of Tippecanoe County, Indiana.

A biography of Morgan & Rachael's son, Samuel H. BURBRIDGE, page 377, Shawnee Township, of the 1881 History of Fountain County, Indiana, provides considerable information on Morgan and family.

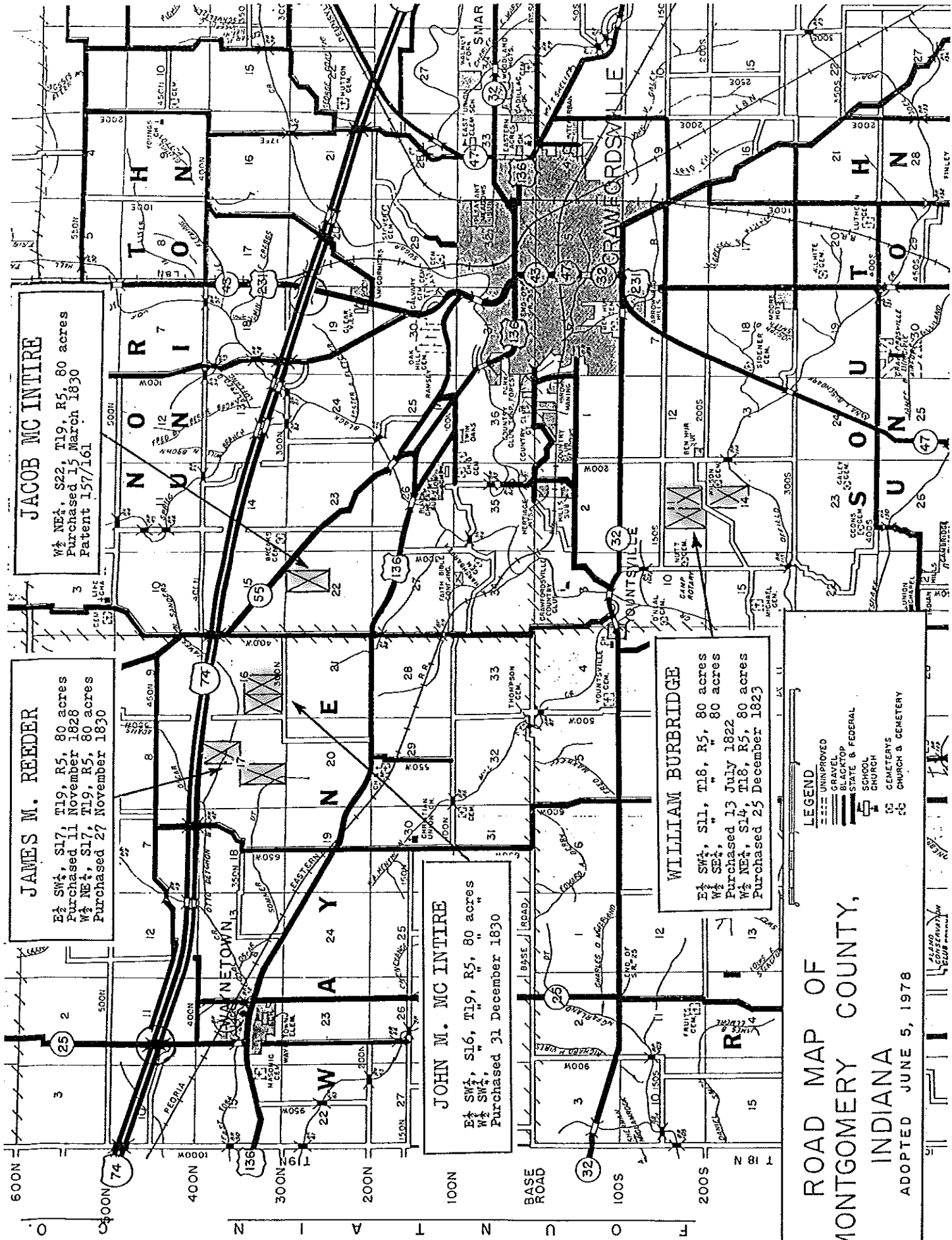

Death of William Burbridge, Sen.

As a public journalist it becomes our sad duty to announce the death of Judge Burbridge. He was born in Greenbrier county, Virginia, September 8th 1778, and died in this city on the 13th inst., at the residence of his son William Burbridge Jr. At an early age he removed with his parents to Lexington, Kentucky, which at that time was merely a stockade fort erected by the settlers as a defense against the attacks of Indians. His youth and early manhood were passed in Kentucky. In the war of 1812 he served as a volunteer in a regiment of Kentucky mounted militia, and was honorably discharged at the close of the war. Shortly afterward he emigrated to Chillicothe, Ohio, whence he removed to Indiana. About the year 1819, before the organization of this County and before any settlements had been made in it, he in company with a friend, made a tour through the trackless forests as far as the Wabash river. His first encampment in this county was made near the springs on the land now owned by the heirs of Major Wainwright. In the year 1812 he removed to Clinton, Indiana, and hence to what is now known as the Gwynn farm, which he bought of the United States Government, and where for many years he lived busily occupied in improving his farm. In the 1st day of September 1823 he was commissioned by Governor Hendricks as one of the first associate Judges of Montgomery county. It is unnecessary in a brief notice like this to speak of the trials and privations endured by the early settlers of the West, the solute will and manly courage with which they met and overcame them. It is sufficient to say that Judge Burbridge endured his full share of trials with his neighbors, and in the interchange of kindly acts, in such a manner that won their esteem and hearty approbation. He lived long to see rise from the unbroken wilderness of the West a Republic greater in the mightiest Monarchies of Europe, once the haunts and homes of wild beasts and savages. In every relation of life Judge Burbridge maintained a high character for probity, honesty and goodness of heart; he possessed in an eminent degree every virtue that honors and embellishes human nature. For more than a quarter of a century he lived a consistent Christian life. Full of years and full of joy he calmly and gently yielded up his life to his God in the full confidence of a blessed immortality.
