

Fix Briton's War Dead at 1,427,634

LONDON, July 13.—(U.P.)—The British Empire's price of survival in five years and eight months of war was revealed officially for the first time today as 1,427,634 persons killed, wounded or missing.

The toll included 532,233 dead or missing and presumed dead, and 559,372 wounded.
