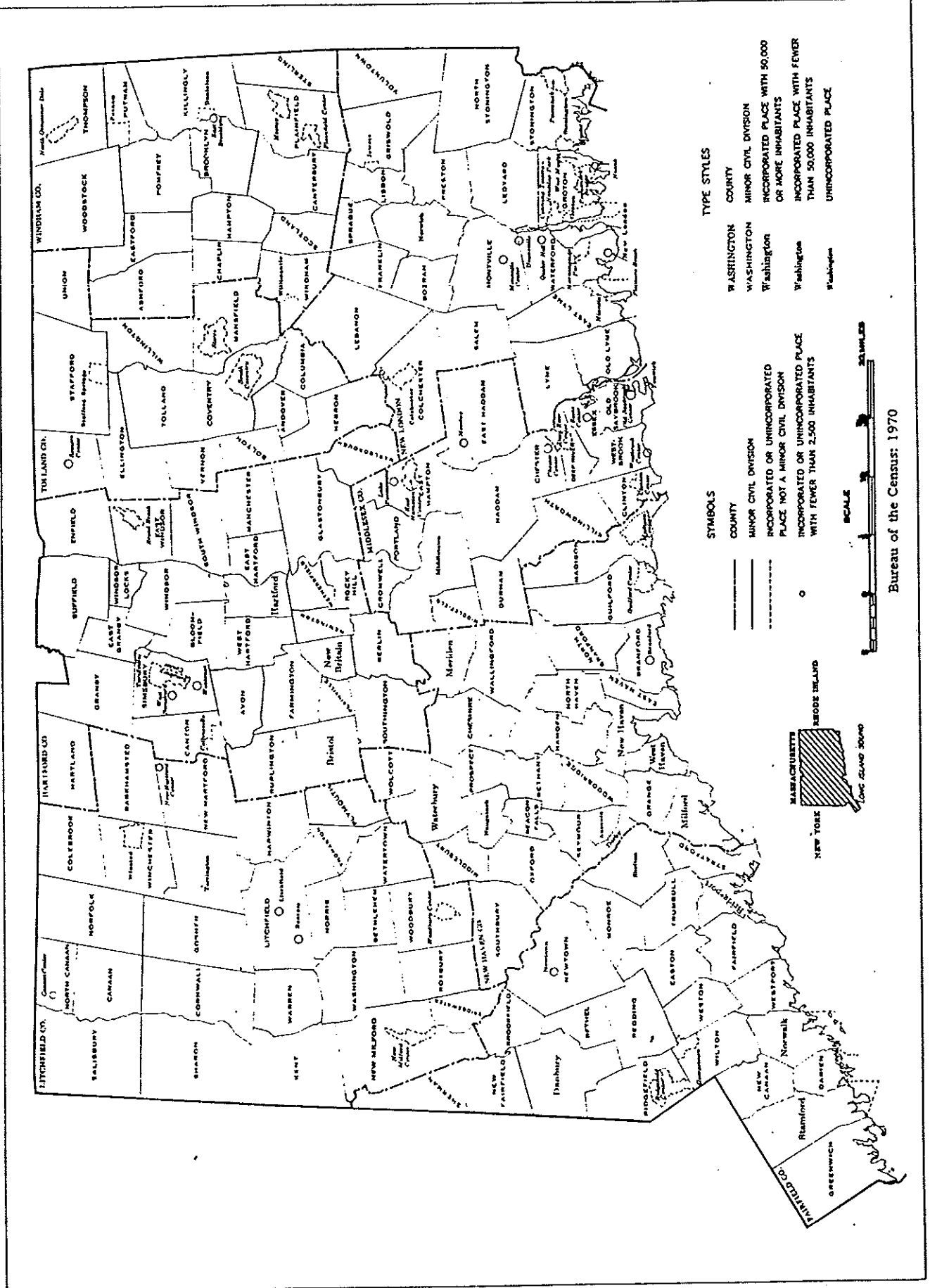


MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS

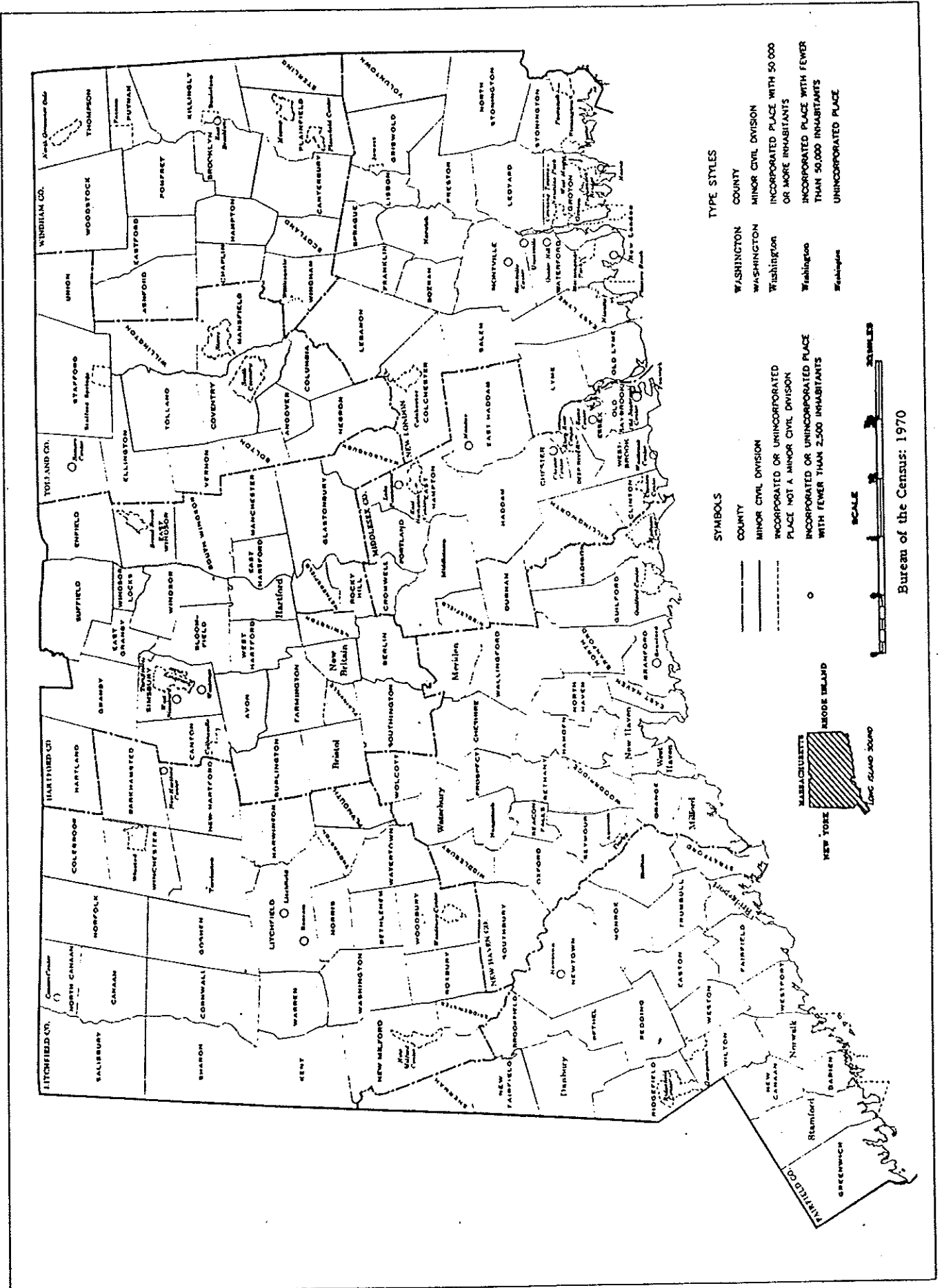

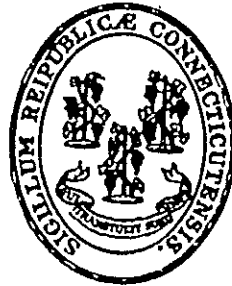
