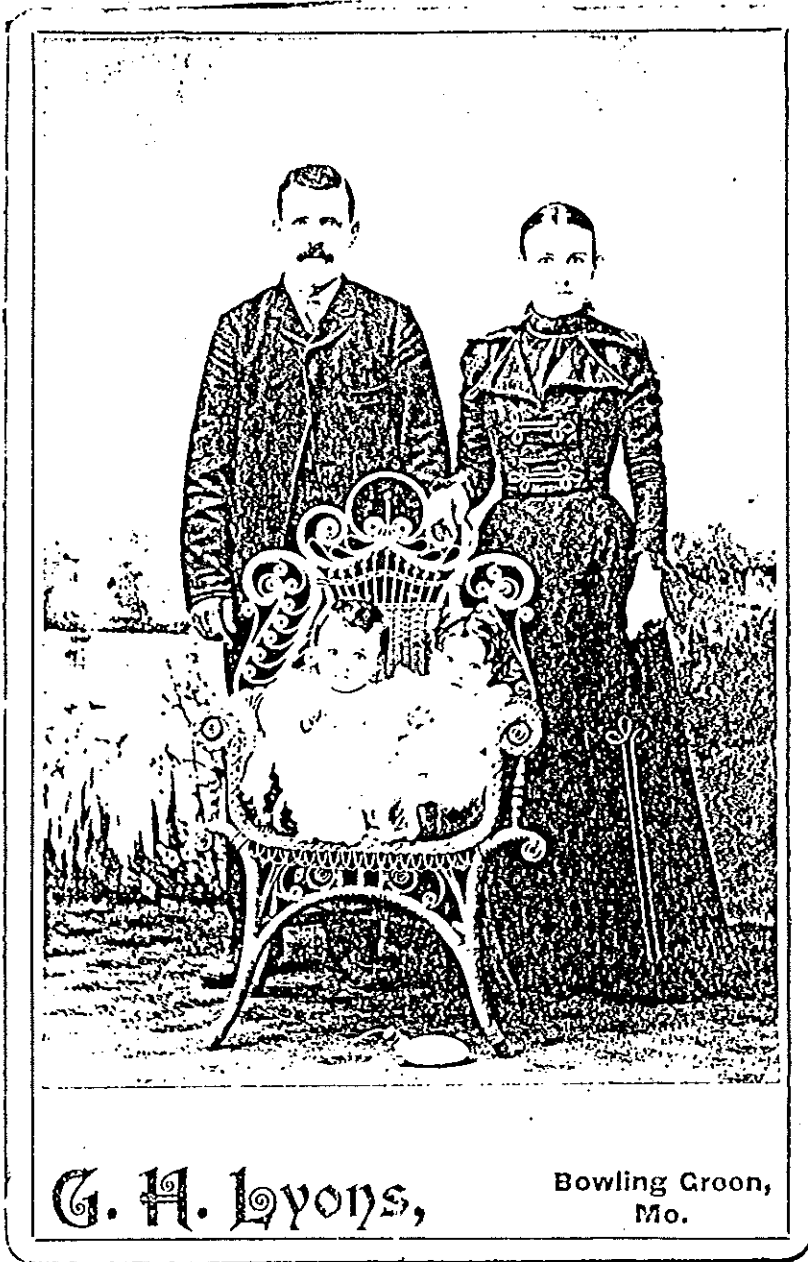

very considerable profit for some years past. Mr. Harness is well known and highly esteemed by the members of the community in which he resides.



M. Haught, farmer and stock-raiser. Among those of Ashley township who are worthy of notice in the history of the county, is the subject of this sketch who was born in Monongalia county, Virginia, son of Tobias and Abigail (Moore) Haught. When three years old his parents removed to Tyler county. He was reared a farmer and received a limited education. He enlisted in August, 1862, in the Fifteenth Virginia Infantry; was engaged in some thirteen battles, during one of which he was severely wounded in the hand. He was married February 25, 1868, to Miss Matilda Moore of Tyler county, Virginia. He came to Pike county in the fall of 1865, and settled in Ashley township. He has a fine farm of 385 acres of good land, under a high state of cultivation. He is engaged quite extensively in stock-raising, his farm being well adapted for that purpose. They are the parents of nine children: Melissa, Peter T., Sarah A., Hester A., Elizabeth E., Ollie, Ida, Lucindia, Michael, and James. Mr. Haught comes of large stock, the combined weight of his parents being 500 pounds. His father was a soldier in the War of 1812.

Elliott Holliday (deceased). This gentleman was a native of Virginia, but when quite young his parents removed to Kentucky, and settled in Clarke county. Here our subject was partially raised, and at an early day he was married to Rachael Johnson of Fayette county. In the fall of 1834 Mr. Holliday moved with his family to Missouri, and settled near Ashley, in Pike county. There were eleven children: Eliza Ann, S. W., Polly, Sally, Nancy, Martha Jane, Emily T., James W., Lewis, Owen, and Margaret. Lewis and Owen Holliday are still living upon the old homestead—two jolly bachelors—dispensing a generous hospitality in a right royal manner. Ashley has no citizens who have more fully the confidence and respect of her people than the Holliday brothers. Their farm is a good one, containing 440 acres of land, and here they both farm and engage in stock-raising, as well as trade very largely in the same. They are active business men, good traders, and altogether responsible.

James Humphreys. Among the pioneer families of Ashley township, of whom our subject is a descendent, may be mentioned Mr. Humphreys, who was born in the state of North Carolina, in August, 1821. His father, Colman Humphreys, was a native of Virginia, and went with his parents to North Carolina in a very early day, where he was raised. In 1827 Mr. Humphreys moved his family to Missouri, and settled near the present town

During the childhood years of their children, William and Maggie lived in the vicinity of Corinth Church on the Lem Patterson farm. They were members of Corinth Presbyterian Church, and the children attended Corinth School.

Harry was married to Ruby

Carver. They were parents of one daughter, Ruby Allene (Mrs. Tom Ellis). Clinnie was married to Arthur Lee Norton, June 7, 1911. They became parents of one daughter, Sarah Elizabeth (Mrs. Homer Sterne). Maggie married Valentine Keeton. They had no

children.

After William's death by drowning on May 12, 1912, Maggie moved to Clarksville and made her home with her daughter Clinnie and her family until her death on June 5, 1936.

Lemuel Bradbury Family

Lemuel Bradbury died in Pike County in 1877. He was the son of Jacob and Patience (Rounds) Bradbury, who with their 13 children floated down the Ohio River on a handmade houseboat built by Jacob. The houseboat was equipped with portholes for defense against the lawless bands of river pirates that then infested the western water courses. It also had a fireplace at each end. The Bradburys wintered at Cairo, Illinois and in the spring of 1827 poled and cordelled up the

Mississippi River landing at Naples, in what was then Morgan County, Illinois.

Jacob Bradbury's ancestry is traced by lineal descent to Sir Thomas Bradbury, who was Lord Mayor of London in 1509. Jacob's great-great-great-great-grandfather emigrated to America in 1634 to take charge of land owned by Sir Ferdiendo Gorges, proprietor of the Province of Maine.

Lemuel Bradbury married Lydia

Repsher of Troy. Their children were: Harriet, Eleanor, George, Nathan, Anson, Thomas and Charles. Eleanor Bradbury married Thomas Kaylor in 1854 and had seven children. One of these children, Mary Eleanor Kaylor, married Fountain H. Williams and to this union was born Gladys (Ladley), Darlene (Kaiser), Guy, Ira and Leslie Alton. Guy Williams married Mary Arminta Wilson. (See Hendrix history.)

Henry Brandenburger Family

Henry Brandenburger, with his wife, Marie Homfeldt, made their home on the edge of Pike and Lincoln Counties in 1946. Their farm home was located in Pike County. The Brandenburger family originally came from Gasconade County, Missouri and are of German background. Both Henry and Marie's families came to the United States to seek freedom from Germany.

On their farm in Pike County they raised five children: Donald, Donna, Larry, Gerald, and Jeanette. Four of the children still live in Pike County.

Donald married Nina Cox and they have two children, Melinda and Jim. They reside in rural New Hartford.

Donna married Randolph Eggering and they live on a farm in Lincoln County. They have nine children: Harry, Victoria, Katherine, Mary, Theresa, Randy, John, Donald, and Timothy. Harry is in the Navy and stationed in Alaska. Victoria is married to Larry Creech and they have a young daughter. Katherine is married to Rick Hurt and they live near Silex. Mary is a college student at Kirksville, Missouri. Theresa, Randy, John, Donald, and Timothy are still at home.

Larry married Wanda Kimey and they live in Bowling Green and have two children, Julie (born July 10, 1972) and Brian (born August 22, 1975). Larry and his brother, Gerald, are Massey-Ferguson dealers in Bowling Green. Their business is

located on Highway 61 North, called "Brandenburger Bros."

Gerald married Christina Dowell Tipton. They have two daughters, Christina and Tammy. Christina had three children by a previous marriage and they were reared in the Brandenburger home. These children are Valerie, James, and David Tipton. Valerie is married to Pat Miller, lives in the Silex area and has a young son. James is single and lives in Bowling Green. David is a student at Silex High School.

Jeanette married Jerry Kuntz and they live on a farm. They have three children, Jeffery, Leah and Jason. Jeffery and Leah are students at Bowling Green schools and Jason is a preschooler.

Alva E. Brandon

Alva E. Brandon, born July 8, 1897 and a resident of Moore-Pike Nursing Home, is the last Brandon

of that surname living in Pike County. His brother, Roscoe R. Brandon, lives in Lincoln County

and he has two sisters in Bowling Green. Mr. Brandon is a retired insurance agent. He was married

March 13, 1920, to Sarah Jane Knock. They operated the Princess Ice Cream Parlor in Bowling Green for a number of years. Before his illness and infirmities of age, Mr. Brandon was known for his quick wit and general good humor. Although Mr. and Mrs. Brandon had no children of their own, they had a host of nieces and nephews and local children who loved them. Mrs. Brandon died April 6, 1968.

Mr. Brandon's great-grandfather, Peter John Brandon, born in Hanover, Germany, in 1787, was sent to Pike County with the St. Louis militia in 1813 to protect the 19 families gathered at Buffalo Fort from the Indians. There he met and

married Nancy McConnell on May 16, 1813. Peter and Nancy Brandon had at least six children. One son, our subject's grandfather, Nathaniel, born February 12, 1827 married Mary Elizabeth Oldfield in 1860. Miss Oldfield was born in Nottinghamshire, England, October 3, 1839. At the age of 10 she came with her parents to America. Her mother died aboard ship and was buried at sea. Her family settled near Mt. Zion Church in Pike County. It was there she met and married Nathaniel Brandon. Nathaniel and Mary Elizabeth had five children: Annie, Oscar, Nannie, Arthur, and Nellie. Oscar was the father of Alva Brandon. Oscar Nathaniel Brandon,

born October 4, 1863, married Ella Elizabeth Haught. She was the daughter of Michael and Matilda Moore Haught. She was born May 6, 1871. Most of their life was lived on a farm near Cyrene.
