The vast concourse of people, who gathered to pay their last tribute of respects to our departed sister speaks silently, yet emphatically of the high esteem in which the deceased and family are held. The funeral services were conducted from Mt. Zion church, in a very impressive manner, Rev. D. S. Priest, her former pastor, officiating. The body was laid to rest in the beautiful Amanda cemetery.

OBITUARY.

In life's journey we have brought to our memory two mile-stones, that of Jan. 5th, 1837 and Nov. 30, 1916; these mark the earthly voyage of Sarah A. Scott, daughter of George and Eliza Halderman.

Nov. 7, 1867, she was united in marriage to John Scott by the Rev. B. N. Spahr. They raised a family of two boys and two girls of which one son and one daughter, 3 grandchildren remain to still strive in life's voyage for a better world and eternal heritage.

Her husband died, December 12, 1900. Since her early childhood she was a consistent member of Mt. Zion Methodist Episcopal church and was known as one who was always willing and ever ready to contribute in all the activities of the church that went toward the advancement of The Heavenly Kingdom.

According to our way of reckoning it may seem hard to lay aside the activities of life, fold our hands and be still. But when God said "It is Finished" she found it easy to abide by God's will and just as the gray-dawn of Thanksgiving was beginning to bring light to us her Spirit answered the Roll Call of God's command and she was not, because her soul was giving thanks in God's Holy presence.

We know that there is a realm beyond the silence of earth, and across the distance of time where Jehova's angel secretary is recording the members of the church triumphant and those "we have loved long since and lost awhile", answer present.

As we stand in the holy twilight of the horizon of our human existence, let us be glad that they have only circled on in their immortal orbits to a higher world, which is the land of the morning and land of the crown.

Funeral services were conducted by her pastor, Rev. M. V. B. Stump, in the Mt. Zion Church, Saturday morning, December 2nd, 1916, interment in Amanda Township cemetery.
