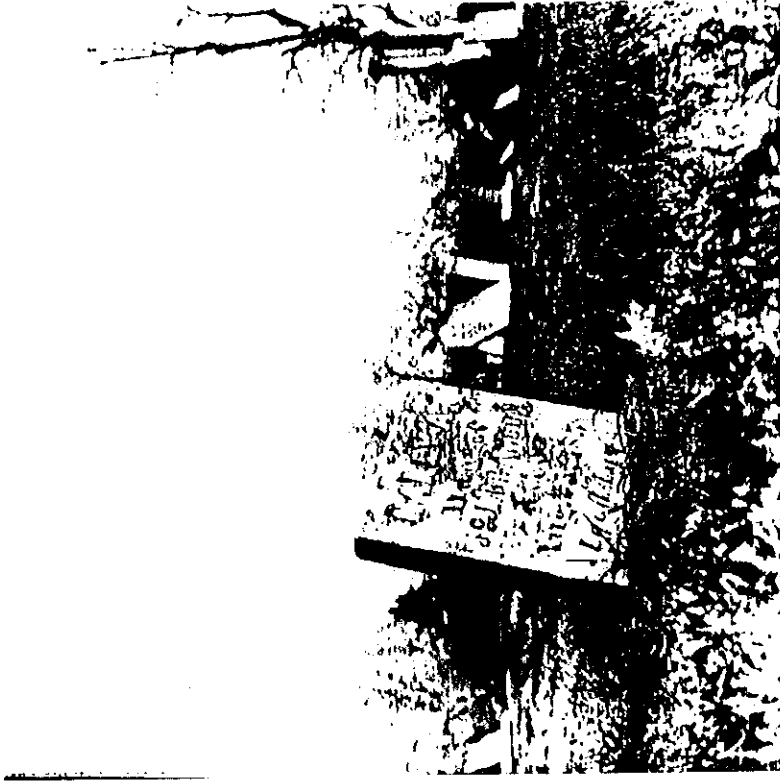
The Land Deed Records of Pike County, Illinois, as kept at the Court House in Pittsfield do not have Grantee - Grantor Indexes. If one does not know the tract that the land is in it is possible that one would have to go through the entire set of tract indexes to find the grantee or grantor they are looking for.

Fortunately the 1850 Pike County, Ills., Census recorded that John Brandon was living in Town 5 S. - 3 W. so the clerk got out Tract Index, T - 5 - S, R2 - 3 - 4W, Detroit, Newburg, Pittsfield, and after looking at all the land transactions in each section, starting at section one, we found John Brandon in Section Twenty-five - SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 25, Town 5, Range 3.

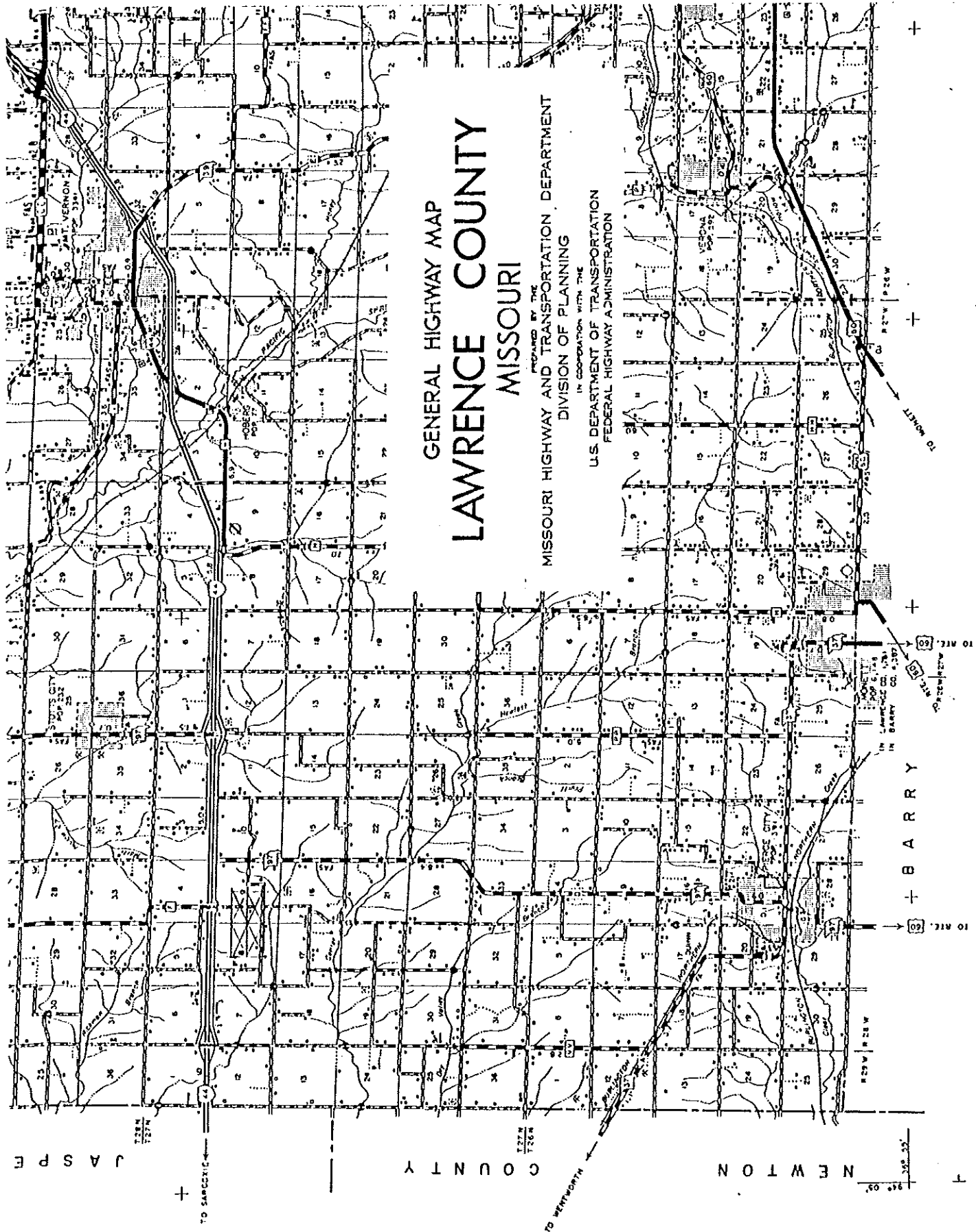
