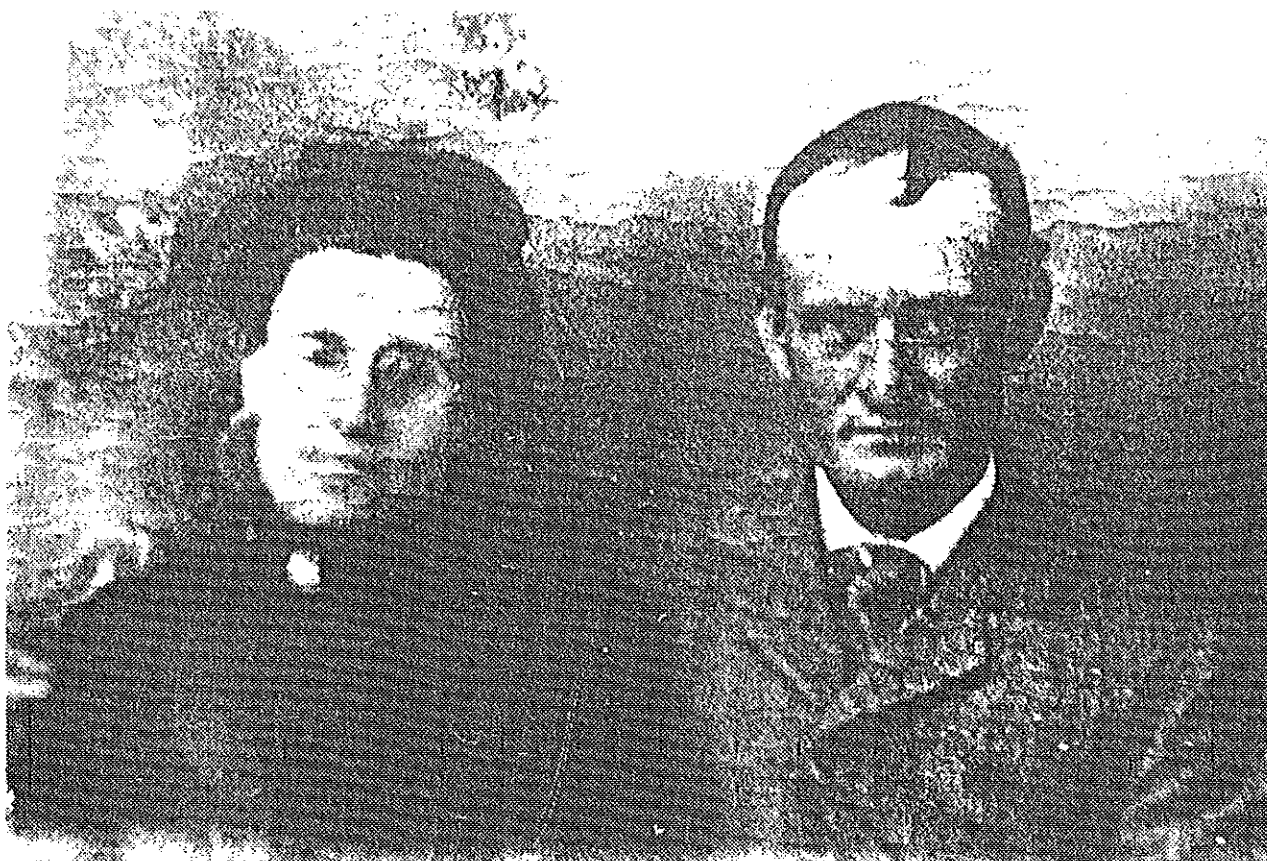

Funeral Services Held Monday  
From New Hartford Church

Mrs. Thomas A. Shepherd of New Hartford, passed away at the St. Elizabeth hospital in Hannibal, Sunday, after a week's illness.

Mrs. Shepherd was born September 15, 1872 near Clarksville. She was the daughter of Nathaniel and Elizabeth Brandon and one of a family of five children. The only one of the children living now is Arthur Brandon of Eckley, Calif.

She was united in marriage to Thomas A. Shepherd April 9, 1890. To this union were born five children, Mrs. D. W. Carroll of Hannibal, Clarence Shepherd, Mrs. Gussie Hopke and Pauline Shepherd of New Hartford community and Malcolm Shepherd, who preceded her in death twenty-six years ago.

She united with the Presbyterian church at eleven years of age and twenty-nine years ago she united with the New Hartford Baptist church, where she remained a faithful member until her death.

Her going will be a loss to the church, community and family whom she served untiringly.

She had made preparations for her death by selecting songs and scripture for her funeral, which were carried out as near as humanly possible.

She is survived by her husband, children, brother and ten grandchildren.

The funeral was held Monday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock from the New Hartford Baptist church, conducted by Rev. L. F. Admire, pastor of the church.

#### DEATH OF MR. THOMAS A. SHEPHERD

One of the most highly respected citizens of New Hartford community passed away at the Pike County Hospital, Friday, August 19, 1938. Thomas A. Shepherd was born October 26, 1862, in Pike County, Missouri, and spent his entire life in this county with the exception of four years, which he spent in the State of Washington. His 75 years were spent in this locality, where he with his wife, the former Nellie Brandon, who preceded him in death four years ago. To their union were born five children, four of whom survive their father. The other child died in infancy. The funeral services for Mr. Shepherd were conducted by Rev. Whiteside at the New Hartford Baptist Church, Sunday afternoon. Mr. Shepherd joined this church in 1928, and has been a faithful member since his conversion. A large concourse of friends were present to pay their last respects to this fine man. Interment was in the Ashley cemetery.

The pallbearers, who were the friends of Mr. Shepherd were A. T. Moss, U. T. Moore, E. G. King, Robert Hopke, Jeff Hickman, and Oscar Young. A quartet composed of Mrs. J. W. Dunn, Mrs. Sadie Stapleton, E. S. Craig and Wilford Craig sang several of his favorite hymns.

The surviving members of Mr. Shepherd's family are: one sister, Mrs. Annie Lane of Middletown, four children, Mrs. Lulu Carroll of Hannibal, Clarence Shepherd, Mrs. Vena Hopke and Mrs. Pauline Craig of New Hartford, 12 grandchildren and a large number of friends.

To the bereaved family, this community extends its sympathy on the passing of this good man.
