At Rest.

Peaceful be thy slumber,
Peaceful in thy grave so low,
Thou no more wilt join our number,

In the afternoon of July 21, Levi Halderman quietly passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. W. C. Leach in this city.

Mr. Halderman was an old settler here having moved with his family to Long Island in 1837 where he has made his home up to the time of his death.

Until his late illness he enjoyed what would be considered good health for a man of his age being 80 years, 6 months and 14 days.

During his illness he suffered intense pain the greater part of the time until death came to release him.

He was a great student and a fine mechanic. While he followed carpentering the greater portion of his life still he was quite an inventor and had several very unique pieces of machinery which was of his own make.

Levi Halderman was born at Lancaster, Fairfield county, Ohio, February 18th., 1826. In 1847 he was united in marriage to Miss Marthaetta Littlefield, and to this union was born nine children, seven boys and two girls. There are five boys and two girls living at the present time. His children were all with him during his last illness except Mrs. J. A. Born of Champaign, Illinois, and G. M. Halderman of Santa Ana, California.

Before his death he professed faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and expressed assurance of Heaven being his destination.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. G. Johnson in the Methodist church, Wednesday afternoon at three o'clock. Interment was made in the family lot in the Long Island cemetery.

The deceased leaves besides his children a host of friends in this community to mourn the death of a faithful friend and a loyal citizen.

A GOOD WOMAN GONE.

Grandma Halderman, wife of Grandpa Levi Halderman, passed quietly away Sunday evening, Nov. 27, 1897, at about 9 o'clock, at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. W. C. Leach, one and one half miles north of this city.

Mrs. Halderman had a severe attack of la grippe last winter, from the effects of which she never fully recovered. She spent most of the past summer in Colorado, and, for a time, it was thought she would again be restored to her accustomed health, but other complications set in and her physicians advised her to return home a few weeks ago.

She was an ardent member, of long standing, of the M. E. Church, from whose edifice in this city her funeral occurred Tuesday afternoon. Her remains were followed to Long Island cemetery by a long procession of sorrowing friends and neighbors, where she was gently laid at rest forever.

She leaves an aged husband and a large family of grown up children who have the unreserved sympathy of all, in their loss of a good wife and kind mother.
