Delia attended rural school east of Beaver City and later attended the Orleans Seminary where she met and married Jesse Sawyer in 1910. They lived various places in Nebraska where Jesse taught school and later retired near Beaver City. In later years they moved to the Norton Manor.

Melvene Packer was born February 14, 1916 in Davenport, Nebraska and died August 27, 1934 at the age of 68. Melvене was a sister of Paul Packer of Norton. Melvене attended school in Powell, Neb., and also Fairbury. After moving to Hastings, Neb. in 1936 she was employed as a loan officer in the bank. From Hastings she made her home in Denver, Colorado until coming to Norton in 1932.

Gladys Ward was born December 12, 1899 in Fairmont, Nebraska and died on August 31, 1934 at the age of 34 years, 3 months, and 19 days. Gladys attended grade and high schools in Fairmont and graduated music college in York, Nebraska. She taught school 13 years in Kansas and 20 years in New York state. In later life she married Ross Ward and they made their home in Long Beach, California.
