IN MEMORIAM.

Virginia Halderman.

Virginia Halderman was the daughter of George and Eliza Halderman, and was born in this county some five miles west of Lancaster, on June 16, 1830, and died September 5, 1904, aged 74 years, 2 months and 10 days. She lived all her life in the region near her birth. At about 17 years of age she joined the M. E. church at Mt. Zion appointment on the Royton charge, during the ministry of Rev. Mr. Morrison.

In the family in which she was born were eight children. Those now living are Levi Halderman of Long Island, Kansas; Mrs. Henry J. This death is the first to break the family circle, composed of the eight children.

Sister Halderman was not able to attend church much for a number of years, owing partly to long distance and to ill health. For a number of years she had been a sufferer, but all that while she was a regular reader of the bible and the church papers, and was always interested in the good things that were going on in the world as opposed to the bad. Patient and sweet spirited, she endured as seeing the invisible. One, After 57 years of life in the church of Jesus Christ, it is our firm conviction that she died in the hope of the Gospel, gone to dwell with her Savior, having heard the Well done, good and faithful servant, enter thou into the joy of thy Lord.

OBITUARY

Anna Halderman, daughter of George and Eliza Halderman, was born, January 5, 1842 and departed this life, January 17, 1925, aged 83 years and 12 days.

She was the seventh of eight children, one brother and six sisters, all of whom have preceded her in death except two sisters, Mrs. Rhoda Slater and Mrs. Rebecca Coffman of Carroll, Ohio.

She was educated in what is now known as the Strode School in Hocking Township, Fairfield County, Ohio, and also attended the Fairfield Union Academy in Pleasantville, Ohio.

She taught several terms of school in the vicinity surrounding her old home where she lived until she moved to her present home just west of Lancaster on the Cedar Hill Pike.
