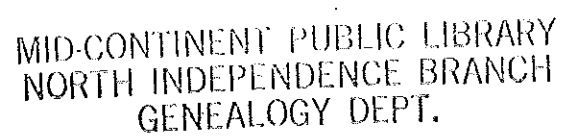

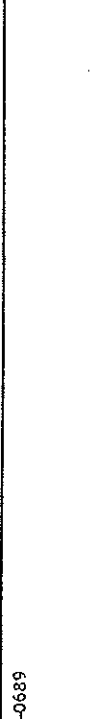

Franklin H. Chapman was born in Medina County, Ohio, Dec. 27, 1827 and died at his home in West Union Friday evening at the age of 79 years. 12-5-1906

In 1842 he removed with his parents to Wisconsin, and in 1852 was married to Miss Caroline West. The following year, 1853, he removed to Fayette Co., where he has resided ever since, with the exception of 3 years spent in Georgia. In Jan. 1899, his wife died and in 1900 he was married to Mrs. Harriet Webb of this place, who with four brothers and a grandson, mourn his death.

Mr. Chapman was converted at the age 14 and in 1850 united with the M. E. church, but after moving to Iowa he became a member of the Advent church, in which faith he lived and died.

Mrs. Robert Criswell of Traer arrived yesterday to visit her aunt, Mrs. Harriet Chapman. Mrs. Chapman, who has been in very poor health for some time, is slightly better the past few days. (Feb. 2, 1921)

Obituary — Mrs. Harriet Chapman

Harriet Tyrrell was born Nov. 18, 1833, in New York state, and died at her home in West Union, Iowa, April 20, 1921, aged eighty-seven years, four months and 28 days. She was the second child of a family of seven children born to Manlius and Esther (Lewis) Tyrrell; she is survived by only one brother, D. W. Tyrrell of DeKalb, Ill., who has been with her at her home since last July and was present at her funeral.

On April 29, 1851, she married Julius F. Webb at Cooksville, Wis. Mr. Webb passed away in January, 1900. To them were born two sons and two daughters. Emma died at the age of two years; Josephine when twenty-one years old; and Edgar L. at the age of thirty-six years. Fred J. died when sixty-two years old, in December, 1915. She is survived by only two descendants, Percy Webb, a grand son and his son, of Sioux City. She has also several surviving nephews and nieces, three of whom came in response to telegrams, they being Mrs. Jones of Woolstock, Mrs. Hirt of Webster City, and Mrs. Criswell of Traer.

Early in her widowhood she married Frank Chapman who died some twelve years ago.

Mrs. Chapman has been a resident of West Union since 1855, with the exception of two years in Wisconsin and a few months in Georgia. Mrs. Chapman was not only a home maker and home keeper, but also was industriously busy, assisting the different tailors with their shop work. For twenty-five years she helped in the Wonenberg tailor shop, and did tailoring for John Sampson also for Frank Schwestka. Her work was always in demand.

She has been a faithful and consistent member of the Seventh Day Adventist church many years, exerting a godly influence among her friends and neighbors. That her friends were numerous was manifest continuously during her last illness of nearly four months' duration.

She will be sadly missed by all her friends, but her good deeds will live on. "She being dead yet speaketh."

The funeral was conducted Friday afternoon by Rev. Gilbert Chalice.
